EU DECENTRALISED BODIES & AGENCIES

A Concise Overview

The decentralised bodies and agencies of the EU handle technical and scientific duties, risk assessments, and project management, aiding in the implementation of EU programs. They equip EU institutions and member countries with expert knowledge in fields such as food, medicine, chemicals, education, justice, security, and fundamental rights. EU bodies are legally distinct and geographically distributed across various European cities, not just Brussels.



These decentralised bodies and agencies are categorised into four groups: Community Agencies, Common Foreign and Security Agencies, Police and Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters Agencies, and Executive Agencies, each handling specific technical and managerial aspects of EU policy areas.



Decentralised agencies:

'Pre-decision-making' agencies, or in another word, agencies that provide "risk assessment". These agencies have considerable influence in shaping the European Commission's "risk management" work, which it conducts freely but shaped by the scientific and technical input from these agencies:



The European Medicines Agency (EMA - after Brexit, relocated to Amsterdam, Netherlands)



The European Food Safety Authority (EFSA - based in Parma, Italy)



The European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA - headquartered in Lisbon, Portugal)



The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA - based in Helsinki, Finland)



The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC based in Stockholm, Sweden)



The European Railway Agency (ERA - headquartered in Valenciennes, France)

Decision-making agencies, able to adopt legally binding instruments (without requiring the Commission's official decision):



The European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO - located in Alicante, Spain)



The Community Plant Variety Office (CPVO based in Angers, France)



The European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA headquartered in Cologne, Germany)



The Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (ACER - seated in Ljubljana, Slovenia)

The following agencies are responsible for the management and regulation of financial markets, and the prevention of systemic risks to prevent another crisis of the Eurozone and financial markets:



The European Banking Authority (EBA headquartered in Paris, France)



The European Securities and Markets Authority (ESMA - located in Paris, France)



The European Insurance and Occupational Pensions Authority (EIOPA - located in Frankfurt am Main, Germany)



The Single Resolution Board (SRB - established in Brussels, Belgium)

Common Foreign and Security Policy Agencies:

These are responsible for scientific and technical management tasks concerning the EU's external relations and security policy. These agencies are the following:



The European Defense Agency (EDA, located in Brussels)



The European Union Institute for Security Studies (EUISS - located in Paris, France)



The European Union Satellite Centre (SatCen - located near Madrid, Spain)

Police and Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters Agencies:



The European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training (also known as the European Police College or CEPOL - headquartered in Budapest, Hungary)



The European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Cooperation (EUROPOL - based in The Hague, Netherlands)



The European Union Agency for Criminal Justice Cooperation (EUROJUST located in The Hague, Netherlands)

Executive Agencies

They deal with the management, most often funding project management, of certain Community programs, such as the 7th Research Framework Program that provides grants for scientific research, or the Lifelong Learning Program that helps students study in other countries. They are located in Brussels, Belgium:
